09:00 am - 13:00 pm	James Rebanks aka @herdyshepherd1, Racy Ghyll Farm, Cumbria. James Rebanks is a farmer based in the Lake District, where his family have lived and worked for over six hundred years. Using traditional native breeds Herdwick sheep and Galloway cattle he practices regenerative farming using low input, sustainable nature friendly methods, the farm now supports 200 species of flowers and grass through enriching the soil, strategic tree and shrub planting and improving water management. As a social influencer with over 160K followers on twitter, 60K followers on Instagram and the author of 3 critically acclaimed books, James uses these platforms to challenge thinking on cheap food culture, globalization and super-efficient, hyper-mechanized, highly productive modern farms with the impacts these have had on biodiversity and carbon emissions and the concepts of Public money for public goods.
