

Advanced clinical CPD course. Edinburgh. 1-3 November 2024

There are five places available on the clinical CPD course organised for ECSRHM residents which will appeal to UK vets aspiring to advanced practitioner status (Sheep). Course numbers are limited to 15 with four hours' on-farm practical work. The course tutors are European sheep specialists Professor Delia Lacasta and Dr Phil Scott. Extensive course notes, images and video recordings of all techniques, common diseases and pathologies will be provided electronically and transferable to smart phones for future on-farm use.

Ultrasonographic examination of other body systems. Delegates are encouraged to bring along/use their own ultrasound machines if different to DP50 and Z60.

- 14.30 Question and answer panel of farm manager and local veterinary practitioner – veterinary services to sheep farmers and opportunities for advanced practitioner/specialist sheep services.
